Economic Crisis Devastating the Poor



Facts about Liberia

Population: 3.4 million
Gross Nat'l Income per Capita: \$140 (\$US)
Life Expectancy: 42 Years
Infant Mortality: 157 (per 1,000 live births)
Child Malnutrition: 21% (under 5 years old)
Access to Improved Water Source: 61%

The weakened global economy has devastated people around the world who are already suffering from natural and man-made disasters, poverty, disease, and malnutrition. It has also stretched our resources like never before.

So far we've been able to continue sending food, pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, clothing, and other critical aid to people in crisis in places like Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Sudan, Uganda, Zambia, Cameroon, Senegal, and Zimbabwe.

International Children's Fund works to meet the desperate needs of countless impoverished African children, pulling them away from the brink of starvation, disease, and victimization. From Sudan in the north to Zimbabwe in the south, International Children's

Fund mission projects benefit local communities across Africa. ***But your support is a vital part of that promise.***

One of the containers of relief aid you helped us ship in February landed in Monrovia, Liberia. The container held 36 pallets of meals — 1,188 boxes, 36 meals per box — 710,496 TOTAL MEALS and was divided to distribute to four of our pastors.

Pastor Ralph Gelego distributed the much-needed food to support his existing orphanage, elementary school, and a vocational training institute. He also went into some rural areas to help. The following is a testimony of the distribution to an orphanage:

Pastor Boakai Paasewe sent a message to the supporters of International Children’s Fund: “We thank God and the donors at International Children’s Fund for this great open door for the feeding of the children in the rural areas of Liberia. We have been able to provide food for 75 children and 40 adults in the rural GrandCape Mount County as well as 75 children and 40 adults at the Living Word Community Daycare School/Children Ministries in Sajanama (meaning of the town, New Town) Grand Cape Mount County. We also gave food to 150 children and 75 adults at the Living Word Church, DayCare school for Children’s Ministries in Gardene Town, and we fed over 200 children and 85 adults at the Living Word

Community Church, Children’s Ministry and Bible school. Praise the Lord!”

Pastor Emmanuel Gyamfi assists people at the New Community Clinic in Liberia. *Pastor Emmanuel shared that in one month time they may see over 1,200 people. Due to the high cost of medical equipment, drugs, medical supplies, and food, they are not able to help people as much as they would like. When the 10 beds are occupied and they have more emergencies, they are forced to tell the patients to go to another place or refer them. Most of the time the patients refuse and cry to just lie on the floor to receive treatment because they believe that the physical and spiritual needs will be met at the clinic. The food that was sent to their aid is helping countless people and they thank the supporters of International Children’s Fund. (see photos on this page)*

Letter from Ms. Esther Yamasu, Sierra Leone:

Dear Dr. Bruenning,

I am a Christian woman, 40 years of age. I came from a Muslim background and by the grace of God I was saved in an outreach crusade. I met Dr. Bruenning at a Pastor and Christian Leaders Seminar in 1993 at the Bo Youth Community Centre. As I attended the seminar, my life was greatly challenged and blessed. Dr. Bruenning imparted great things in my life that led me to new experiences and made a great difference. I thank God for that seminar. Although during that time there was war and not much later my village was attacked by rebels that totally devastated us, I said thanks to God who took us through and was able to deliver us and thanks to Dr. Bruenning for encouraging us.

After the war we continue with the Lord's work and we are pressing on. Presently we are renting a building for fellowship and we meet four times a week. We have over 250 members, including children. I believe the hand of God is upon the life of Dr. Bruenning, and by the grace of God I waste no time to share my heart.
